NONRESIDENT STUDENTS

Students who are eligible to attend an lowa public school but who are not legal residents of the school district may be admitted into the school district at the discretion of the superintendent upon application and payment of tuition. The tuition rate shall be the current per-pupil cost of the school district as computed by the board secretary and as authorized by the lowa Department of Education for general education students and actual costs for students entitled to special education services.

Resident students whose families move from the school district after the start of a semester and who wish to complete the semester in their former school district will be permitted to stay in the former school district. Students who plan to open enroll to their former resident district for the next school year may do so without approval of the Board.

Students in grades eleven or twelve who are no longer residents of the school district, but were residents in the preceding school year, may continue to attend school until they graduate without the payment of tuition. These students must have an adult, who resides in the school district, identified for purposes of administration.

Nonresident students who are eligible to attend an lowa public school and who have evidence they will become legal residents of the school district prior to October 1st may be allowed to attend without the payment of tuition.
